



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Protect from injuries obtained through sport</li> <li>● Protect from deviance of other players</li> <li>● Protect against potential spectator behaviour</li> <li>● Dispute contracts with employer</li> <li>● Dispute contracts with sponsors</li> <li>● Compensation / Loss of earnings</li> <li>● Equal opps / Protect from discrimination</li> <li>● Protect from sexual abuse / racism</li> <li>● Negligence of officials and coaches</li> <li>● Protect against media intrusion into private lives</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Negligence: Conduct that falls below a 'reasonable person standard' and leads to a breach of the duty of care, which results in foreseeable harm to another</li> <li>● Duty of care: A legal obligation imposed on someone if they are responsible for a group of people</li> <li>● Officials have a duty to eliminate dangers</li> <li>● Participants can contest in a safe environment</li> <li>● Referees can be found liable for injuries sustained by players</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Providing first aid provision</li> <li>● Maintain the right supervision / Ratio of participants to adults</li> <li>● Balanced competition</li> <li>● Collect medical information</li> <li>● Contact details for incidents</li> <li>● Risk assess</li> <li>● Dangers are planned for / Health &amp; safety</li> <li>● Check the facility / equipment / clothing</li> <li>● Adapt sessions to the needs / ability of the participants</li> <li>● Suitably training</li> <li>● DBS / Safeguarding / 1st aid</li> <li>● Educated on type of abuse</li> <li>● Educate on dangers of drugs / supplements</li> <li>● Awareness of overtraining</li> <li>● Correct training type / method</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Taylor report</li> <li>● Spectators must act within the law</li> <li>● All seater stadia</li> <li>● Control of alcohol sales</li> <li>● Specified kick-off times</li> <li>● Increased security / police presence</li> <li>● Intelligence gathering</li> <li>● Police liaison</li> <li>● Tough deterrents - bans, fines, imprisonment</li> <li>● Occupiers Liability Act - 1957</li> <li>● Safety at Sports Grounds Act 1975</li> <li>● Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol) Act 1985</li> <li>● Fire Safety &amp; Safety of Places of Sport Act 1987</li> <li>● Football Spectators Act 1989</li> <li>● Football Offences Act 1991</li> </ul>


## Impact of commercialisation, sponsorship and the media on the performer



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

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
